- Strive to achieve high standards of work and behaviour through building good relationships and developing a sense of responsibility.

- Contact parents if there is a problem with attendance, punctuality or equipment.
- Let parents know at an early stage about any concerns or problems that affect their child's work or behaviour.

- Arrange Parents' Evenings during which progress will be discussed.
- Monitor each individual's learning and achievement, taking appropriate action when necessary.
- Welcome parents into academies, and will endeavor to reply to telephone calls within one Academy day.
- Keep parents informed about Academy activities through regular correspondence.
- Provide a pleasant attractive environment, which is stimulating to the learner, whilst at the same time being safe and secure.
